- The story has many parts, many angles. It played out in locations and disciplines beyond the battle fields, extending to every state and across Europe.
- The story also has many parallels to the US today. Listen to the words of Jefferson Davis and you'll hear those same words at any Tea Party rally.
- If Lincoln had not been re-elected in 1864, it is doubtful whether Barack Obama could have been elected in 2008. And Lincoln's re-election was in serious jeopardy as the Confederates regrouped after the summer of '63. His fate rested on the success of the Union Army.
- It was not until September 2, 1864, when Atlanta surrendered to General Sherman, that Lincoln's re-election was assured.
- In between Lincoln's election in 1860 and 1865, it was "life-or-death" for the world's first experiment with democracy.
- That daily drama the battle lines, the homefronts, the politics, both domestically and abroad, the economy, the heroes and the fallen will be brought to life, 150 years later, through the communication methods of the 21st Century.
